



## **RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE SHARED GOVERNANCE OF THE TIME PLACE & MANNER POLICY**

**WHEREAS**, San Francisco State University's Associated Students is the official voice of students; and

**WHEREAS**, a number of events on campus have caused our campus community concern and disturbance; and

**WHEREAS**, controversial events are within a group's right to freedom of expression, despite being unaligned with this Board or Associated Students's values; and

**WHEREAS**, Students and campus community have and may continue to experience harm and threats to their identities as a result of past and future events; and

**WHEREAS**, The event has triggered significant confusion as to why such controversial events are allowable; and

**WHEREAS**, These events will continue to occur on campus due to SFSU's unique history of social justice and support of underserved communities, with significant contribution by Associated Students; and

**WHEREAS**, Events on campus are governed by the Time, Place, and Manner Policy that is under the charge of a university committee which does not currently have student representation; and

**WHEREAS**, It is CSU policy that "associated student body organizations are involved in campus policy development as full participants"<sup>1</sup>; and

**WHEREAS**, The student voice is important in any and all policies and decisions impacting student life and campus climate; and
